Better Curriculum and Assessment Information for Parents

Following a few conversations with individual and groups of parents, I have discussed with staff ways of improving the way we keep you informed and involved about what your child is expected to learn, also their progress against end of year assessment targets.

When you attend Meet the Teacher next week you will be given a letter giving you information about how we have improved things. If you aren't able to make the meeting, the information will be sent home with your child in an envelope on 15th September. Please check your child's bag that night.

I am very grateful to the parents who spoke / met with me to discuss this matter - especially the parents of children who are currently in Y4 and Y5. I have told staff that we have made an absolute commitment to you that we will do everything possible to help each child reach their age —related end of year target. Most importantly, we absolutely have made the commitment that the teacher will let you know swiftly if at any point in the school year your child is in danger of not meeting his / her end of year age related expectation.

Please do not hesitate to contact me if you feel at any point this year you need to discuss your child's progress.

Packed Lunches

Please note than any parent wishing their child to have a packed lunch MUST make an appointment to meet with Mrs. Armstrong BEFORE the child starts to stay for packed lunch.

Before the meeting you are asked to:

- First have met with Ms. Clark or Mrs. Holland to see if we can help your child choose options they will enjoy from the lunch menu.
- •If this is unsuccessful you are asked to read the packed lunch policy which is available on the website or at the main school office) to ensure you are prepared to adhere to the policy.
- •Then arrange an appointment with Mrs. Armstrong. In this meeting you will be asked to sign the agreement saying you will follow the policy and ensure your child brings to school a packed lunch that is healthy and part of their daily balanced diet.
