Forgotten instruments for Music Lessons

It has been drawn to my attention that some children regularly forget their musical instruments for lessons taught by our peripatetic music teachers. This cause disruption to lessons and, as a result, other children do not receive their entitlement of quality music teaching time – while teachers search for spare, working instruments, or by asking other children to share instruments.

I therefore give notice to parents / carers of children who have instrumental lessons in school that, if your child forgets their instrument, they will not be allowed to attend the lesson. Parents will still be charged, however, because the pay for instrumental teachers is determined by the number of children we have on roll for the children to have lessons in any given term.

This system will be implemented from Monday 4th February.

I also take this opportunity to remind parents / carers that children should not leave their instruments in school. In the first place we do not have sufficient space to store them safely, but, more importantly, children are expected to practice their instrument at home.


