	Elevation of land and mountains	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tallest is Mount Olympus (2,918m) near Thessaly • Many mountain ranges and land height which is considerably above sea level 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tallest is Scafell Pike (978m) in Cumbria • Some mountain ranges but majority of land height is close to sea level

KEY VOCABULARY

Tier 2

- **compare** - say the similarities and differences between 2 things
- **explain** - say why something is that way or how you know something
- **summarise** - a short statement to give an overall idea of a range of points

Tier 3

- **climate** - weather patterns over a long period of time
- **economy** - system of trade/industry to make/use money
- **elevation** - how high something is above sea level
- **population** - how many people live in a place
- **rural** - place with small settlements, countryside
- **settlement** - where people choose to live
- **urban** - developed areas, towns/cities, large population
