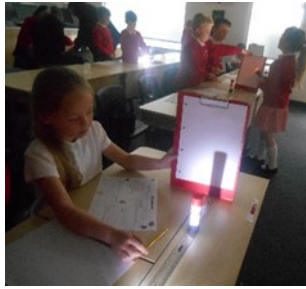

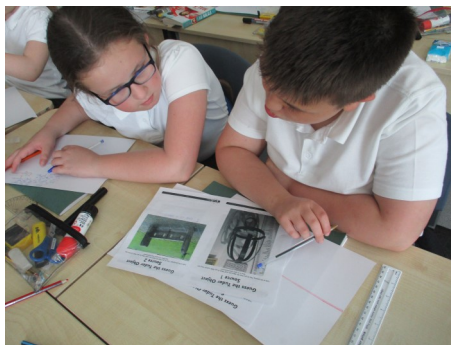
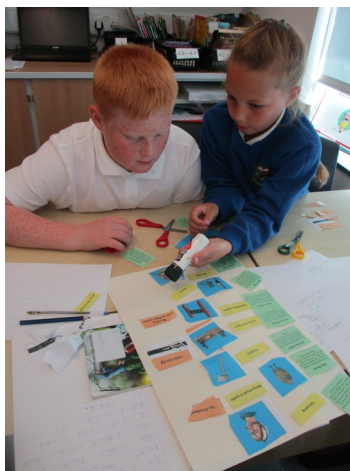
Year 3

Year 3 have really enjoyed learning about lights and shadows in Science this half term. In each lesson, we have used a range of scientific skills. We carried out a lot of practical enquiries that helped us to learn that darkness is the absence of light, how shadows are formed, which materials make shadows last and how our shadows change. As a class we set up an enquiry to pattern spot how our shadows change in size when we move the light source further away.



Year 5

This week in History, Year 5 have been learning about crime and punishment in Tudor times. We learned that a bridle would be a punishment for gossip and that treason was punishable by stretching on a rack! We compared this to what we had learned in the Spring about crime and punishment in Anglo Saxon times and then discussed how the justice system works today.



Year 1

Year 1 have been learning how to programme Beebots as part of their computing lessons. We have learnt how to send the Beebot to different people and pictures using different directions. We have also been practising giving instructions and using our right and left directions.



Year 6

Year 6 are currently completing a unit all about bread as part of their DT lessons and it is fantastic to see that someone has taken their learning home to try out before they make it in school. Miss Abernethy was delighted to receive these amazing photographs this week showing the delicious bread Alexander and his mum have been baking at home. Well done, Alexander!
