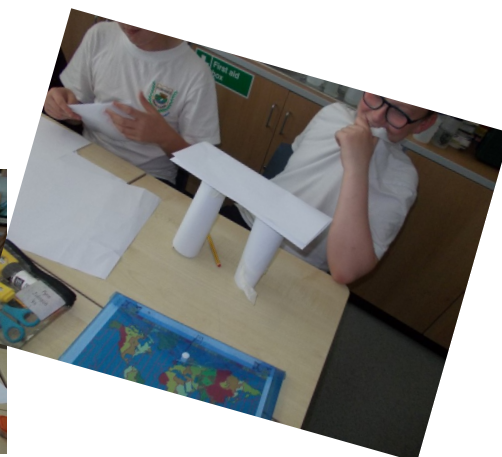
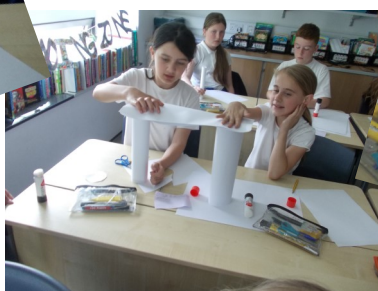
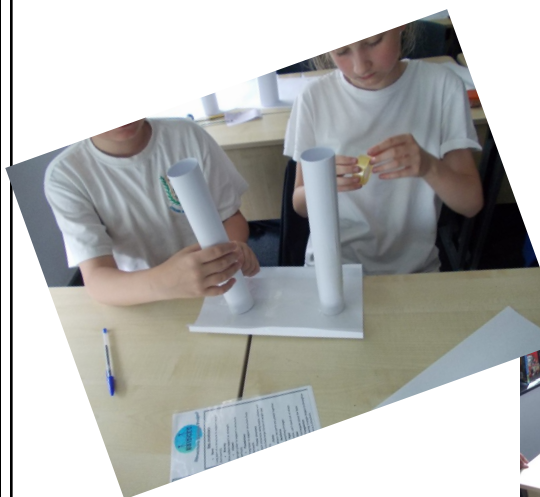
### Year 5

### Year 3
