COVID-19

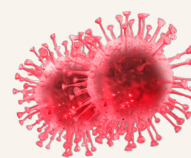
As you will be aware, cases in Sunderland (and nationally) are significantly on the increase. Please remember to follow our one-way system (even when a member of staff isn't there) and social distance while on school site.

If anyone in your household has one of the 3 main symptoms, your whole household should isolate while you arrange for, and wait for the results of, a PCR test.

The most common symptoms of COVID-19 are recent onset of:

- new continuous cough and/or
- high temperature and/or
- a loss of, or change in, normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)

If you or your child are required to isolate, this means there is the possibility that you/they may develop coronavirus. This means that you/they must not leave your home for any reason – if you need food or medicine, order it online or by phone, or ask friends and family to drop it off at your home. You should also not have visitors in your home, including friends and family – except for essential care. Unfortunately, I have received several reports of children who should be isolating being seen around the estate, at the shops/supermarket etc. Please help to keep the whole community of Hylton Castle safe by following the rules and then hopefully we can get back to normality more quickly.
