of everyone involved!

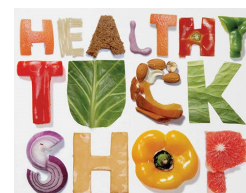


Tuck Shop

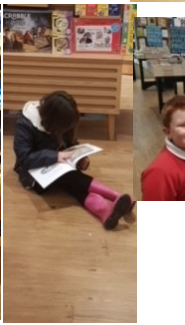

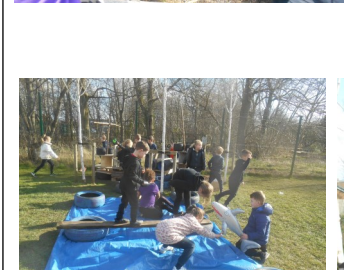
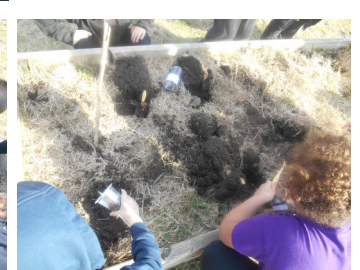
Year 4
